<p>1</p> <p>What is the difference between an emergency kit & an evacuation kit?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your EMERGENCY KIT contains important items to keep your household safe for at least 3 days of isolation during disasters • Your EVACUATION KIT contains the important items to take with you if you need to evacuate your home quickly 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medication • First aid kit • Mobile phone, charger & power pack • Battery operated radio (to tune in to warnings) • Canned food and can opener • Torch & spare batteries • Books and boardgames • Spare clothing • Bedding • Pet supplies 	<p>6</p> <p>A location outside the home where everyone can safely meet in an emergency such as the mail box or neighbours house.</p> <p>Do you know where your household safe meeting point is?</p>	<p>What is a household safe meeting point?</p>

<p>Fold each corner to the opposite corner. Open paper up. You should have creases in your paper that look like this.</p> <p>1</p>  <p>Artwork face down.</p>	<p>Fold all corners to centre of the paper.</p> <p>2</p> 	<p>Now your paper should look like this.</p> <p>3</p> 	<p>Now turn your paper over so the folds you just made are face down.</p> <p>4</p> 	<p>Just like in step 2, fold all corners of the centre of the paper.</p> <p>5</p> 
<p>Your paper should now look something like this.</p> <p>6</p> 	<p>Now fold your paper in half vertically and horizontally.</p> <p>7</p> 	<p>Slip the pointer finger and thumb from each hand under the square flaps, pinching the folds.</p> <p>8</p> 	<p>Finished product.</p> <p>9</p> 	<p>HOW TO GET STARTED</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ask a friend to pick a colour on the outside of the chatterbox. Open and close the chatterbox to spell out the chosen colour. 2. Ask your friend to pick a number displayed on the inside. Open and close the chatterbox that many times. 3. Ask your friend to pick another number, read the question, lift the flap and read out the answer.
